Pool Rules and Guidelines

1. **You must be at least 12 years of age to enter the club facility without adult supervision.**
2. The pool facility is used at your own risk. We will not be responsible for lost or damaged personal property or theft of property.
3. **The baby pool is strictly for non-swimmers 5 years of age or younger. Children must be supervised by an adult at all times in this pool.**
4. PLEASE accompany small children to the bathroom and also ask them periodically if they need to use the bathroom as this will cut down on the number of 'accidents' in the pool.
5. **Non-swimmers are not permitted to use the slides or diving board. Users must be able to swim to the ladders unassisted.**
6. Any damage to pool property will be charged to the offender or their parents. If a guest damages pool property, the member signing the guest in will be accountable for the damages.
7. **NO toys or rafts may be taken/worn in the upper pool (attached flotation devices are allowed).**
8. NO indecent conduct, vulgar language, smoking or glass beverages or alcoholic beverages in the club facility.
9. **NO squirt water devices are permitted in the pools.**
10. DO NOT talk to or distract the lifeguards on duty unless there is an emergency or serious situation.
11. **NO RUNNING around any pool area.**
12. Diving is permitted in areas that are 5 feet or deeper.
13. **NO cannonballs, twists, flips or jumping backwards off the side of the pools.**
14. NO goggles permitted on the diving board or slides.
15. **Not more than one bounce on the diving board.**
16. NO aqua socks, or shoes may be worn in any of the pools.
17. **NO gutter ball in the three feet area of the lower pool.**
18. Horseplay in or out of the water will not be permitted.
19. **NO food, gum or candy allowed in the pools.**
20. ALL trash must be deposited in the waste containers.
21. **The LAP LANE is reserved for members swimming laps continuously. Two members may share the lap lanes at a time.**
22. ALL persons should shower before entering the pools. This is STATE LAW.
